

Agreement Between Dearborn Public Library and Metro Detroit Linux Users Group
10-01-2014

The Dearborn Public Library and Metro Detroit Linux Users Group (MDLUG) agree to partner to provide free technology workshops for the public. Unless the parties agree in writing to continue with this agreement, this agreement will terminate on March 31, 2015.

MDLUG is a not-for-profit local organization whose goal is to teach others about computers. They generally meet on the second Saturday of each month, from 12:00p-2:30p, but will adjust their meeting day / time for the months of June-August. Each monthly meeting begins with their general business and ends with a technology presentation. Membership in their organization and attendance at their meetings are free and open to all.

The Dearborn Public Library will:

- provide a location for the group to meet monthly, during regular library hours
- provide a location for the group to present technology workshops in addition to their monthly meetings
- provide necessary technology to facilitate each meeting / workshop (limited to technology the library already owns for use by the public such as a projector, screen, microphone)
- provide marketing via library website
- provide flyer for workshops as needed
- manage registration for workshops (if necessary)

MDLUG will:

- ensure that attendance at their meetings and workshops will be free and open to the public
- present at least 3 workshops (2-4 hours in length) between Oct. 1st, 2014 and March 31st, 2015 on a mutually-agreed-upon general technology topic that are in addition to their monthly meetings
- provide confirmation and specific details of workshop content 2 weeks prior to each scheduled event, so the library can prepare flyer and promote on the library website
